The paramedics were able to find the capsule and report my allergy. However, for reasons I am not quite clear, a second ambulance arrived and well, they were the ones that ended up taking me to the hospital. Unbeknownst to me, the second crew of paramedics was unaware of my allergies even though it was written on the report from the first group.

I was in deep pain due to a bowel constriction and one of the paramedics gave me a Morphine shot. The moment it went into my veins I knew what was happening. I told the crew I was allergic, as I could not breathe and I was itchy all over. Finally, I was given another shot to counteract the reaction.

I ended up staying in the hospital for 10 days, receiving treatment for a bowel condition, and experienced angina attacks and severe heart pain. It was during my stay in the hospital that I decided to purchase a medical ID bracelet.

I have had other medical ID bracelets and necklaces, but they always burned my skin. However I realized then I needed to get a gold one in order to help me be able to wear one and hopefully avoid further mistakes should I require medical help again. I went into a hospital in November for foot surgery and they wanted to take my medical bracelet off and I said no. I glued the fastener with crazy glue and it is never coming off. All went well.
