Florida Seniors at Risk for Leaving Unsupervised From Regulated Care Facilities Are Required by Law to Carry Medical Identification

HOUSTON – November 28, 2006 – While it has always been a good idea for individuals with Alzheimer's disease to wear a medical ID clearly stating their condition, medications and emergency contact information, it is now a Florida state law that all Alzheimer's patients — and those with other conditions that put them at risk for leaving a facility unsupervised — have identification on their bodies that include their name, the facility's name, address and telephone number. The best way to display this essential information is on the patient's body — on medical identification jewelry.

"Medical IDs are critical for Alzheimer's patients," said Rick Russell, founder and CEO of American Medical ID, a company that makes personalized medical identification jewelry. "For patients who can't speak for themselves or those who wander off and can't remember critical information about conditions or emergency contacts, a medical ID is a reliable device that can save a person's life by helping emergency responders return them safely to caretakers or family."
